Interim Management Report of Fund Performance

Results of Operations

As at June 30, 2025, CC&L Global Long Short Fund (the "Fund") held \$21.9 million in total net assets. During the period, investors in Series A units in the Fund experienced a return of 8.49%. The benchmark for the Fund (FTSE TMX Canada 91-Day TBill Index) returned 0.00% over the same period. The performance of the different series within the Fund will vary due to the differences in their expense structures. For specific returns by series, please refer to the "Past Performance" section of this report.

Global equity markets experienced significant turmoil as President Trump's higher-than-expected tariff announcements triggered sharp selloffs. However, as the second quarter of 2025 progressed, market sentiment improved meaningfully. A temporary easing in trade tensions, along with resilient corporate earnings and stronger-than-expected economic data, reduced recession concerns and supported a broad recovery in risk assets. Global sector performance reflected the improvement in investor sentiment, with cyclical sectors, on average, outperforming defensive sectors. Technology and Communication Services emerged as the top performing global sectors in the second guarter, while Health Care and Energy were the weakest performers.

Growth metrics in our model had a strong period, with intermediate to long-term industry and stock-specific price trends generally remaining persistent, and fundamental stock-level growth indicators being rewarded. Value underperformed long-term expectations as stocks priced attractively relative to their underlying fundamentals were not rewarded by investors. Quality also lagged, as metrics linked to earnings sustainability were not rewarded in the marketplace. Among Opportunity composites, Structural was rewarded in line with long-term expectations. The performance of Efficiency and Complexity was subdued, particularly in the second half of the reporting period, as the market focused on incorporating the rapid informational changes primarily through direct as opposed to indirect channels. Both Efficiency and Complexity rebounded in June, performing in relatively close alignment with long-term expectations.

The portfolio delivered a strong positive return in the first half of 2025. Both country-sector allocation and security selection contributed positively to performance. Security selection within Chinese technology and US health care sectors were the notable contributors. In particular, stock picking within Chinese application software companies was rewarded. From a country-sector allocation perspective, the long positions in Korean industrials and Norway industrials were the largest contributors to performance while the short positions in Poland energy detracted.

Leverage

Leverage occurs when the Fund borrows money or securities, or uses derivatives, to generate investment exposure that is greater than the amount invested.

The Fund's leverage is determined by calculating the aggregate exposure through the sum of following: (i) the market value of the Fund's short positions; (ii) the amount of cash borrowed for investment purposes; and (iii) the notional value of the Fund's specified derivatives positions excluding any specified derivatives used for hedging purposes. The Fund's exposure to leverage must not exceed 300% of the Fund's Net Asset Value ("NAV").

During the period ended June 30, 2025, the Fund's aggregate exposure to leverage ranged from 94.9% to 366.2% of the Fund's NAV. The Fund exceeded the 300% aggregate leverage limit for a period of four days in January, 2025 as a result of a large redemption which reduced the net asset value of the Fund. This brief increase in aggregate exposure to leverage did not have a material impact on the Fund.

As at June 30, 2025, the Fund's aggregate exposure was 120.4% of the Fund's NAV. The primary sources of leverage were short positions in equity securities, short equity swap contracts and cash borrowing.

A component of the Fund's leverage is cash borrowing. Such facilities are repayable on demand. During the period ended June 30, 2025, the Fund's range of cash borrowing was \$2,336 to \$20,367,779. As at June 30, 2025, cash borrowing represented 0.0% of the Fund's NAV.

Recent Developments

The overall level of investment opportunity across our model (as measured by the dispersion of return forecasts) remains close to its long-term average level. Systematic and specific risk forecasts experienced significant upticks in April but have, in most cases, returned to levels broadly in line with long-term averages. One exception is the systematic risk of our Beta factor, which remains moderately elevated relative to historical levels.

During the period ended June 30, 2025, no additions or deletions were made to the portfolio managers providing services to the Fund.

As Manager, CFI receives management and performance fees with respect to the day-to-day business and operations of the Fund as described in the section entitled "Management and Performance Fees". These management and performance fees are charged in the normal course of business and are measured at their exchange amount, which approximates that of an arm's length transaction.

Recommendations or reports by the Independent Review Committee

The Independent Review Committee tabled no special reports and made no reportable material recommendations to the manager of the Fund during the period ended June 30, 2025.

⁽³⁾ The Manager of the Fund, CC&L Funds Inc., may waive certain fees or absorb certain expenses otherwise payable by the Fund. The amount of expenses waived or absorbed is determined periodically on a series by series basis at the discretion of the manager and the manager can terminate the waiver or absorption at any time.

⁽⁴⁾ The Fund's portfolio turnover rate indicates how actively the Fund's portfolio advisor trades its portfolio investments. A portfolio turnover rate of 100% is equivalent to the Fund buying and selling all of the securities in its portfolio once in the course of the year. The higher a Fund's portfolio turnover in a year, the greater the trading costs payable by the Fund in the year, and the greater the chance of an investor receiving taxable capital gains in the year. There is not necessarily a relationship between a high turnover rate and the performance of the Fund.

⁽⁵⁾ The trading expense ratio represents margin interest, borrow fees on investments sold short, total commissions and other portfolio transaction costs expressed as an annualized percentage of daily average net asset value during the period.

MANAGEMENT AND PERFORMANCE FEES

Management Fees

The Fund is managed by CFI. As consideration for providing investment advisory and management services, CFI receives a management fee from the Fund, based on the net asset value of the respective series, calculated daily and payable monthly in arrears. In respect of units of all series of the Fund other than Series I, the management fee is paid by the Portfolio to CFI. Management fees in respect of Series I units are arranged directly and charged outside the Portfolio. Management fees on Series I units are not expenses of the Portfolio. CFI uses a portion of management fees to pay for trailing commissions to registered dealers (if applicable) based on amounts invested in the Fund. CFI uses the remaining portion of the management fees to pay for investment advice, including fees charged by the Fund's portfolio manager, and general administration expenses and retains the balance for profit. The following table summarizes the annual management fee rates (excluding GST and HST) of each series of the Fund, expressed as a percentage of the Fund's value, and the portion used for dealer compensation and the portion used for or attributed to investment advice, general administration and profit.

Performance Fees

The Fund pays a quarterly performance fee to the Manager, calculated and accrued daily. The performance fee is 20% of the net outperformance over the Hurdle, subject to a perpetual high-water mark. The Hurdle is 4.00% per annum. The performance fee is applicable to Series A and Series F units. Unitholders of Series I units may negotiate a performance fee to be paid by the investor directly to the Manager.



PAST PERFORMANCE - CC&L GLOBAL LONG SHORT FUND SERIES F



PAST PERFORMANCE - CC&L GLOBAL LONG SHORT FUND SERIES I




